FIRE

Structure Fire on Terrace Drive

On January 11, the Fire Department responded to a structure fire on the 8600 block of Terrace Drive. The crews arrived to find a working fire in the garage of a two-story residence. The fire was quickly contained and did not extend into the house. Three units from El Cerrito responded as well as mutual aid from Berkeley and Richmond. Upon investigating the cause of the fire, crews located the charger and remains of electric bicycle batteries at the origin. The house occupants confirmed that they had the batteries plugged in at the time of the fire. This is the second fire in 6 months related to charging batteries for electric bicycles.

Hillside Natural Area


For the past few weeks, fire crews have been burning piles of brush in the Hillside Natural Area near Memorial Grove as well as above the recycling center. These are piles that were made last year by the landscape crews as well as the CAL FIRE crews that have been doing work for us. Next week we again expect to have the hand crews back in the parks doing more clearing and preventative work.

2018 Emergency Response Overview

The information provided in this overview is intended provide 1) an understanding of the Fire Department's calls for services in the past year and 2) a comparison for the past 5 years. The El Cerrito Fire Department responds to a wide variety of calls for service as follows:

- Fire Structure Fires, Vehicle Fires, Wildland Fires, Explosions
- Medical Rescues, Vehicle Accidents

- Hazardous Condition Spills, Electrical Problems, Toxic Conditions
- Service Calls Person in Distress, Lock Outs, Water Problems
- Good Intent Cancelled Calls, Wrong Locations, No Hazard Found
- False Calls False Alarms, System Malfunctions, Malicious False Alarms



The Fire Department responds to an average of 3,350 calls for service per year; the following is a list of total responses for the past five years:

The Fire Department's total responses decreased 133 calls for service in 2018 from 2017. The major cause for this change is that 2018 was the first full year of Contra Costa County Regional Fire Communication Center (Con Fire) dispatched for Fire Department. As a dedicated fire communication center, Con Fire triages all medical calls. Many incidents that the Fire Department would have responded to are considered non-emergency and ambulance-only responses. Although the medical emergencies decreased by 267 calls, the requests for public services increased by 144 calls, again due to medical triage services.

Even with this decrease, the trend in Fire Department responses has increased 13% over the last 5 years and will continue to grow as more residential units are built. These service impacts will need to be discussed in the future.

The following lists the financial costs due to fire for the City of El Cerrito from 2014 thru 2018:

Costs due to fire during 2014 to 2018 averaged \$249,002 per year. This increase is primarily due to the commercial fire at Barbara's Fashions a few months ago. However, the costs averages remain low compared to cities with similar demographics. The total value of the properties that experienced fire damages in 2018 exceeded \$33 million.

In summary, we suspect that requests for services will continue to increase over the next calendar year.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

SB272 Compliance

Existing law requires state and local agencies to make their records available for public inspection, unless an exemption from disclosure applies. POLICE

Holiday Season Update

The El Cerrito Police Department focused on Driving under the Influence (DUI) enforcement as the holiday season approached. In the months of November and December, El Cerrito officers made 22 DUI related arrests. Officers, Community Service Officers and Cadets also did public outreach on auto burglary prevention at El Cerrito Plaza by designing and handing out flyers. The flyers included safety tips for securing valuables while shopping.

Training and Personnel

During the month of December, El Cerrito Police Department staff attended 15 different training sessions. These classes included K9 training, SWAT training, Peer Support training and firearm/rifle training. ECPD also welcomed a new Part-Time Community Service Officer, Syed Shah.

Community Police Academy
