In Memoriam

It is with tremendous sadness that the City of El Cerrito announces the passing of long-time former City Council Member Janet Abelson. Janet passed peacefully on January 26, 2023. She was 76.

“Janet leaves a tremendous legacy in El Cerrito,” said Mayor Lisa Motoyama. “She is integral to the fabric of our City; her family is our family. We were all looking forward to see what she’d take on in her next life stage off the Council, and to not have that is difficult for all of us. We are all here to continue the work she started and to aspire to the level of dedication Janet has shown to serving the people of El Cerrito. On a personal note, Janet was the first person to ask me to run for City Council and it is because of her support that I am Mayor today. As Mayor, I have directed City staff to lower the flag to half staff in her honor.”

Janet Abelson was first elected to El Cerrito City Council in 1999 and provided 23 years of thoughtful public service as one of the Bay Area’s most enduring political figures. Since then, Janet served a record five terms as Mayor (2002, 2006, 2010, 2014, and 2017). On Council, she championed disadvantaged populations, advocating tirelessly for a number of key issues including transit accessibility and services for low income residents, such as the Student Bus Pass Program. Her self-proclaimed titular piece of legislation, the 2014 San Pablo Avenue Specific Plan, continues to play a key role in informing El Cerrito’s progressive future.

An El Cerrito resident since 1970, Janet Abelson was dedicated to providing lasting solutions to better her community. Outside of El Cerrito City Council, Janet brought prowess and wisdom to a number of organizations, including: West Contra Costa Transportation Authority Committee (Chair), Contra Costa Transportation Authority (Chair), East Bay Division, League of California Cities (Chair), Chamber of Commerce (Member), League of Women Voters (Vice President Membership), Soroptimist International of El Cerrito (President), Bayside Council of Parent Teacher Associations (Vice President), PTA of Harding and El Cerrito High School (Member), EL Cerrito High School Archiving Committee, and California Walks (Treasurer).

The El Cerrito City Council and the entire City staff team sends their deepest condolences to the family, friends, and colleagues of Janet Abelson. She is already truly missed. Arrangements are pending and will be shared by the City once they are available.

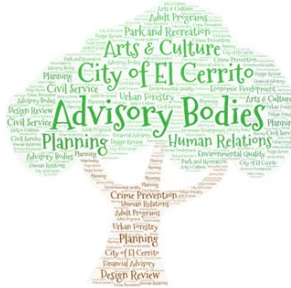

Update on Public Meetings Subject to the Brown Act

On October 17, 2022, Governor Newsom announced the COVID-19 State of Emergency would end on February 28, 2023, and the City of El Cerrito's Local Emergency ended on December 31, 2022. In addition, new legislation went into effect establishing remote participation exceptions in certain circumstances. These changes to regulations and circumstances surrounding remote participation will affect the City Council as well as Boards, Commissions, and Committees (Advisory Bodies.) Here is what you need to know:

Assembly Bill (AB) 361

Without the existence of a state or local emergency in place, the City will no longer meet the statutory requirements to hold fully remote meetings for City Council and City Advisory Bodies.

Assembly Bill (AB) 2449

Regulations in effect as of January 1, 2023, establish certain exceptions for remote participation of members of a legislative body, and related requirements for public agencies. If an exception under this regulation is utilized by a member of the legislative body to participate remotely (without disclosure and access to the remote location), the member must participate with both audio and video. A quorum of the legislative body must participate in-person from a single location that is open to the public **and** the agency is required to provide a two-way electronic platform to allow members of the public to hear, observe, and participate remotely in the meeting.

Original Brown Act Teleconferencing Provisions

Existing legislation under the Brown Act allows remote participation by a member of the legislative body so long as the remote location is identified on the agenda and open to the public. Under the existing rules, the agency is **not** required to provide a means for members of the public to participate remotely, nor is the member required to participate with both audio and video.

What this means for City Council Meetings

The method of providing in-person and remote public access at City Council meetings will not change. If a member of the City Council wishes to participate remotely under AB2449, they are limited to certain circumstances and the number of times used in a calendar year.

What this means for City Advisory Body Meetings

Effective March 1, 2023 all City Boards, Commissions, and Committees will return to meeting in person only and all meetings will be held in the City Council Chambers. Members of these City Advisory Bodies will **not** be eligible to utilize the exemptions under AB2449 as the City does not currently have staffing or resources to satisfy the statutory requirements. If a member wishes to participate remotely, they can do so by phone, however no method of remote public participation will be provided.

Building Permits



For the month of December, 91 building permits were issued; 47 permits were “finaled” (e.g., closed out); and 140 new permit applications were received. Currently, the application processing for building permits requiring plan check is up to 45 days from the date a complete application is submitted, and staff are working diligently to reduce that turnaround time to 30 days or less.

Cannabis Update

Between 2020-2021, Authentic El Cerrito was one of two cannabis dispensers approved to operate in the City. Both Cannabis Operating Permits require contributions to the City in the form of community benefits fees in addition to annual gross receipt payments. Authentic El Cerrito, located at 10764-10770 San Pablo Avenue, is slated to begin construction this month to undergo building improvements with the intent of opening in summer 2023. FIRE

CPR/First Aid Class on February 4

The El Cerrito Fire Department will be offering its first CPR/First Aid Class of 2023 on Saturday, February 4 from 8:30 - 4:30 PM. Operations

The El Cerrito Fire Department provided the helicopter rescue technician for the Devils Slide vehicle accident off of HWY 1 when a family of four plummeted off a two-hundred-foot cliff in a Tesla. A CHP helicopter staffed by an El Cerrito Firefighter operating as a rescue technician airlifted the family from the bottom of the cliff. All of the victims survived. CHP frequently uses El Cerrito firefighters as rescue technicians for their high level of training and capability. The CHP helicopter crew notifies our Department when they need a highly skilled rescue technician and pick our firefighter up enroute to the incident.

Administration

The El Cerrito Fire Department assisted Contra Costa County in securing a Homeland Security grant to purchase medical kits for the Fire Department and law enforcement for active shooter responses. The kit includes specialty gear to treat traumatic injuries during intentional mass causality incidents and training equipment for firefighters and law enforcement officers. The trend of mass killing continues to rise, and the Fire Department is constantly preparing for an effective response.

Training

The El Cerrito Fire Department initiated training for the behavioral health unit and peer support group. The training will occur during 2023 and includes classes on group and individual crisis intervention, advanced group crisis intervention, and suicide prevention and intervention/postvention. Suicide continues to be one of the leading causes of death in the fire service, and ECFD is taking action to support its firefighters.

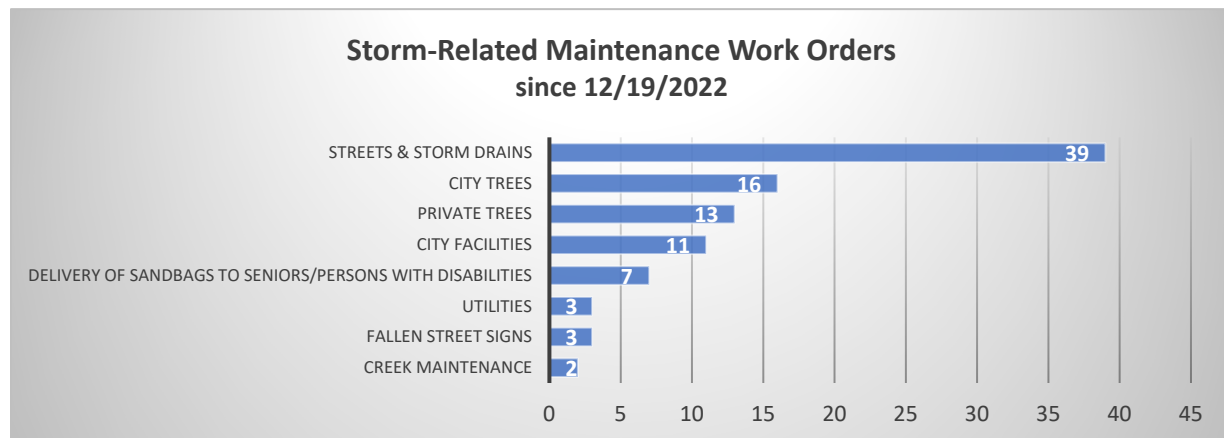

Storm Response in Public Works

It has been a busy month for the City’s Public Works Department, preparing for storms, responding to issues at all hours of the day and night, and quickly making streets, sidewalks and paths safe for travel. (The picture shown displays the Public Works Maintenance team quickly working to reopen a section of the Ohlone Greenway which was flooded in early January.)

While there were heavy downpours and incidents of localized flooding and downed trees across the community, overall, the City thus far has had relatively minor issues when compared to other communities across the State. The credit in part goes to the proactive work done by the Maintenance team before and during the rains, inspecting and clearing drain inlets, headwalls, and other “hot spots” to minimize the potential for serious issues. Additionally, between December 19th and January 17th, Maintenance responded to 94 storm-related requests as summarized below. Credit also goes to our residents who keep creeks on their properties clear of debris as well as assist the City by clearing storm drain inlets in front of their homes before and during storm events.



There were some notable storm-related issues, including a large tree that fell at Arlington Park, with thankfully no injuries or property damage, a flooded section of the Ohlone Greenway, several other City tree failures, runoff from the Hillside Natural Area, and more recently a small sink hole that has developed behind the sidewalk on Colusa Avenue due to a broken storm drainpipe. Public Works staff addressed these issues as soon as possible in some cases with temporary measures. The Public Works Engineering team is working with a contractor to repair the Colusa Avenue pipe as quickly as possible and further evaluating next steps for other locations that may need a more substantial repair to resolve.

During the last few weeks, the City also provided nearly 2,000 free sandbags to community members. With the potential for more rain this season, Public Works is continuing to provide up to ten (10) sandbags per household to help prevent flooding from the street. The sand pile and bags are at the El Cerrito Recycling Center at 7501 Schmidt Lane. (Proof of residency in El Cerrito or Kensington must be provided).

El Cerrito Receives Grant Funding to Support Clean Indoor Air

In partnership with Contra Costa Health Services, the City of El Cerrito has received funding of more than \$30,000 through the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD) AB 836 Clean Air Center Program to obtain more than 20 new portable air filters that will allow the City to provide Clean Air to vulnerable populations during smoke events. Like many cities, the City of El Cerrito has



had to grapple with unhealthy air quality due to wildfire smoke, bringing youth programs indoors and even temporarily shutting some facilities. With the new air filters, the City will be able to not only bring programs indoors at the Community Center, Clubhouses that house youth programs, Hana Gardens Senior Center, and the El Cerrito Library, but additionally use the air filters to ensure the air is clean and healthy for the vulnerable populations these facilities serve. Additionally, the City will have the ability to potentially open a clean air center for vulnerable populations if the need arises. Last, the portable air filters will allow the public, including vulnerable populations, to access Clean Air while accessing City services.

Dan Peddycord, Climate and Health Policy Officer for CCHS who has been leading the effort, explained that exposure to air pollutants is one of the greatest threats to human health, so the BAAQMD grant was an opportunity too good to pass up. Children are particularly at risk when the Air Quality Index exceeds 150, as it often has during wildfire events. It is expected that the clean air centers will decrease preventable health events, like eye and lung irritation and

Kensington Residents Now Able to Drop-off Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) at the Recycling Center on Tuesdays

The Household Hazardous Waste collection that takes place on Tuesdays at the Recycling + Environmental Resource Center (RERC) is provided through a partnership with RecycleMore and West County Resource Recovery. Recently, negotiations took place to allow Kensington residents access to the Tuesday HHW collection at the RERC, closing the gap for communities served in West Contra Costa County. Now, all West Contra Costa County communities from Kensington to Hercules can drop off HHW on Tuesdays from 9am to 4pm, with proof of residency. This adjustment further establishes the Recycling Center as a regional one-stop shop for waste diversion.



Common HHW items include garden products (pesticides & fertilizers), propane gas cylinders, hazardous aerosols/cleaners/sprays & poisons, auto products (gasoline, cleaners, polishes), paints, solvents, thinners, & adhesives, photo & pool chemicals, and mercury thermometers & switches. Electronics, batteries, fluorescent tubes and CFLs, pharmaceuticals, sharps, used motor oil and filters, and used cooking oil are accepted every day the Recycling Center is open. 

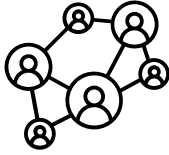
