CITY HALL ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC USE

The City of El Cerrito has installed an electric vehicle (EV) charging station at City Hall and the station is open for public use! The Station provides “Level II” charging for \$1.25 per hour (a full 4-hour charge costs \$5.00 for most electric vehicles). The station is part of the ChargePoint system and can be accessed by drivers with a ChargePass card. Other credit cards are also accepted using a phone-in option that is displayed on the station. The station is located in the El Cerrito City Hall parking lot at 10890 San Pablo Ave. Parking for EV charging is limited to 4 hours per session.

The station was made possible through a rebate program with ChargePoint Incorporated that provided the charging equipment for free. Supporting the development of an EV charging infrastructure is a strategy included in the City’s recently adopted Climate Action Plan. City staff is actively looking for more grant and site opportunities to increase the number of public charging stations in El Cerrito. STREET SWEEPING PROGRAM KEEPS BAY WATER CLEAN

El Cerrito’s street sweeping program is part of the City’s Clean Water Program. Street sweeping collects trash, debris and other pollutants from the street that would otherwise get into the storm drain system, and from there to the San Francisco Bay. In El Cerrito, sweeping on residential and arterial streets may occur between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. Commercial areas are swept each Monday night, and residential streets are swept once a month. Sweeping does not occur on rainy days or if the street is wet. The full street sweeping map is available online at www.el-cerrito.org/streetsweeping

Please use the following guidelines to help keep our streets and water clean:

- Know your street sweeping day and park cars off the street on your scheduled sweeping day
- Do not put leaves or other yard waste in the street
- Keep landscape plants pruned back far enough to allow sweepers to sweep against curb
- Notify the City Arborist 510-215-4333 if City street tree branches obstruct the path of the sweeper

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN!

Controlling rain (a.k.a. storm water runoff) is critical to controlling water pollution. Rainwater moves contaminants, such as motor oil, fertilizers, pesticides, and animal waste, from the ground into the storm drain system, and eventually into San Francisco Bay. Part of El Cerrito's stormwater management program is to educate residents about this problem. You can help lessen the impact of contaminated stormwater runoff on local waterways by making sure that only clean rain water goes down the storm drain. For example, El Cerrito residents and businesses should:

- Reduce use of fertilizers and pesticides
- Not spill or dump hazardous materials like motor oil and paint into the gutter
- Assist street sweepers by parking elsewhere on street sweeping days
- **Report illegal dumping into storm drains by calling 1-800-NODUMPING (1-800-663-8674)**

Litter, such as wrappers, plastics, and cigarette butts, and leaves in the street can also get washed into storm drains. In addition to polluting waterways, litter and leaves can block storm drain grates and contribute to temporary flooding after a heavy rain. If you have a storm drain grate in the street near your home or business, please check it frequently to make sure it is not blocked, especially during wet weather. SOLID WASTE COLLECTION HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

The El Cerrito Recycling + Environmental Resource Center and East Bay Sanitary Offices will be closed for business on September 2, November 11, November 28 & 29, December 24 & 25, and January 1. Curbside collection of Recycling, Green Waste and Garbage will occur as normally scheduled on these dates, **except for December 25 and January 1** – collection for those days and all subsequent days those same weeks will occur one day later than normal, with Friday collections occurring on Saturday.
